## Message of the General Manager

### « Sustained efforts for the implementation of SNIM social projects »

This report showcases our strong commitment to fighting poverty and advancing sustainable development in the communities we serve.

This report presents our achievements, our challenges and our vision for the future, focused on our collective commitment to serve our communities sustainably.

Our goal is to support communities in SNIM's region to overcome poverty and vulnerability.

In this context, finding solutions to the structural and recurring water issue in this arid zone was a priority area of intervention in 2023.

Our research and drilling program has made it possible, with the extension of the brackish water treatment plant near the town of

Zouerate, at the end of 2023, to strengthen the drinking water production capacity.

This program has brought a range of benefits to local communities, including: multiplication of animals watering places, control of transhumance circuits, development of local agro-pastoral activities, promotion of income-generating activities gardening activities in the localities of Choum, F'derick and the mining site of T014 (Zouerate).

The extension of support for affiliation to the National Health Insurance Fund to all retirees of SNIM Group subsidiaries has been a noticeable action in the health sector which we spent 5.27% of the Foundation's budget.

Without forgetting other sectors, such as religious, social and cultural activities, we allocated for education sector 27.23% of our budget in 2023. Our spending in this area focused on the development of school infrastructure and equipment, following the needs expressed by the Government or local communities.

# 1. PRESENTATION OF THE SNIM FOUNDATION

The SNIM Foundation, based in Can-sado-Nouadhibou, Mauritania, is a non-political, non-union, and non-profit organization committed to regional development and the reintegration of re-tired workers. Founded in 2007 under the legal regime enshrining freedom of asso-ciation, it benefits from an independent legal personality as well as administrative and financial autonomy.

Recognized as being of public utility organization since 2012, the foundation works closely with administrative au-thorities to promote sustainable develop-ment at the local and national levels. The SNIM Foundation is actively invol-ved in identifying investment opportuni-ties along the railway corridor between Nouadhibou and Zouerate and supports

the socio-economic reintegration of re-tired SNIM workers within its scope of ac-tivity.

The Foundation facilitates microcredit access for local communities, promotes entrepreneurship, and shares best prac-tices for poverty reduction. As a non-pro-fit organization, it aspires to play a ca-talytic role in integrated development, in partnership with local authorities and grassroots communities.

The governing bodies of the Founda-tion include the General Assembly, the Management Committee and the Ge-neral Management. And an Auditor is appointed to verify and certify the ma-nagement of the Foundation.

## Vision and mission

The Foundation aims to be a **nationally recognized leader in social and economic development.**

This vision is focused on innovation, sustainability and excellence, in all its initiatives. It aims to catalyze social and economic progress, to be a driver of

positive change and to be the model of a holistic approach to development. The Foundation strives to build strong partnerships, implement innovative programs and act as a catalyst for inclusive growth, while being guided by the principles of accountability and transparency.

Highlighting the participation of different stakeholders, the vision of the Foundation is a strong ambition to create a positive and sustainable impact on the lives of the targeted populations. **06** Promoting good governance.



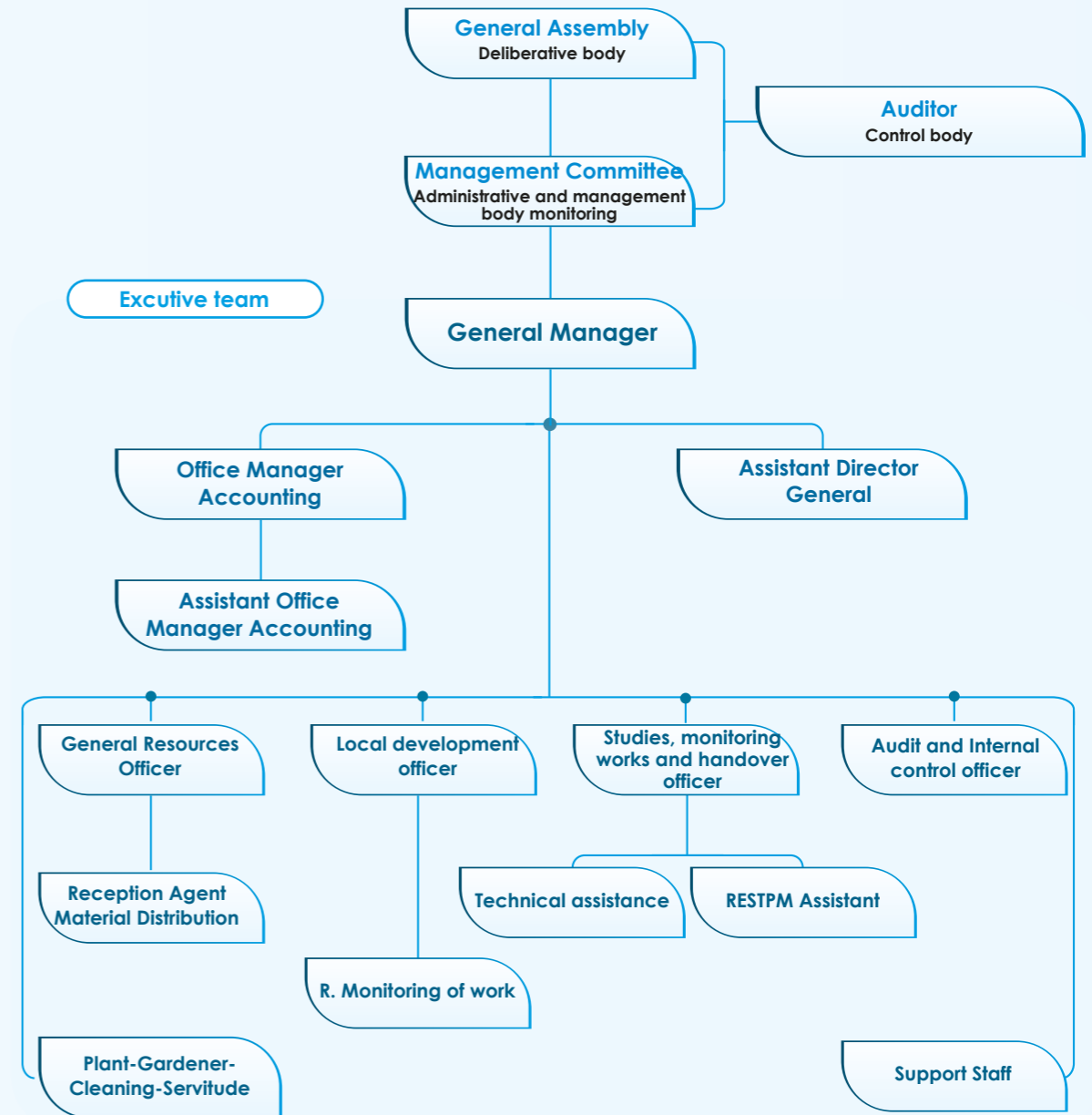

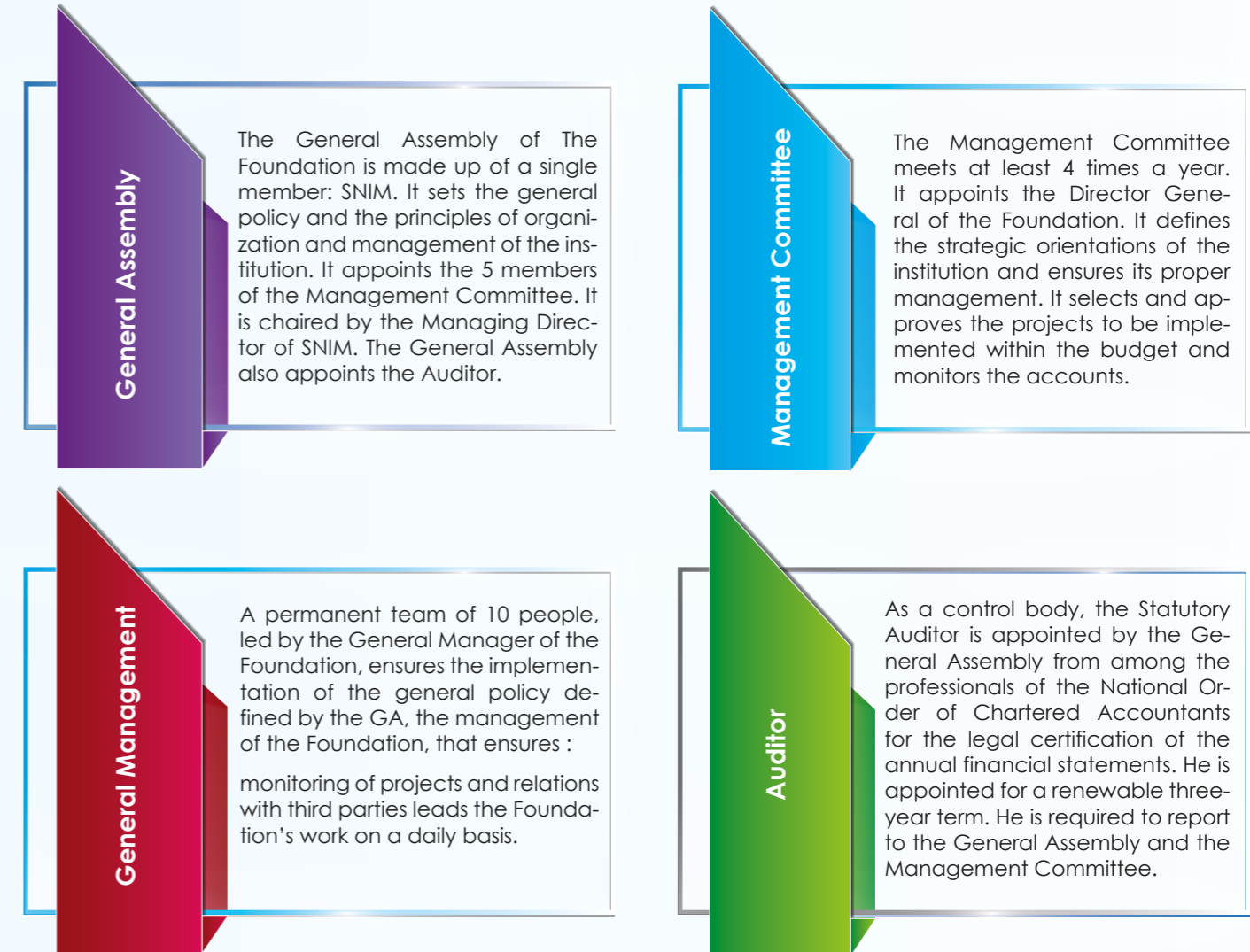
### Ethics and Compliance:

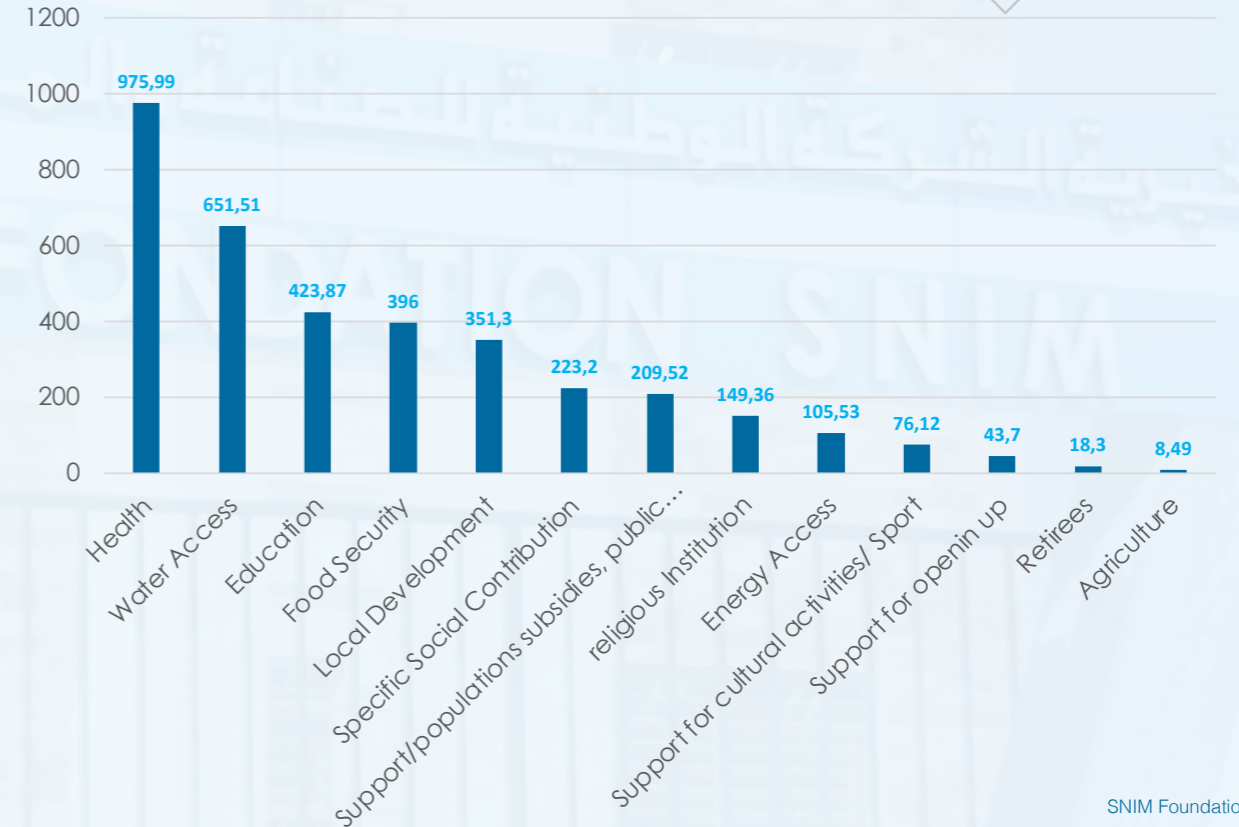

Graph 1: Overview of cumulative activities by sector, 2007-2023 (in MMRU)

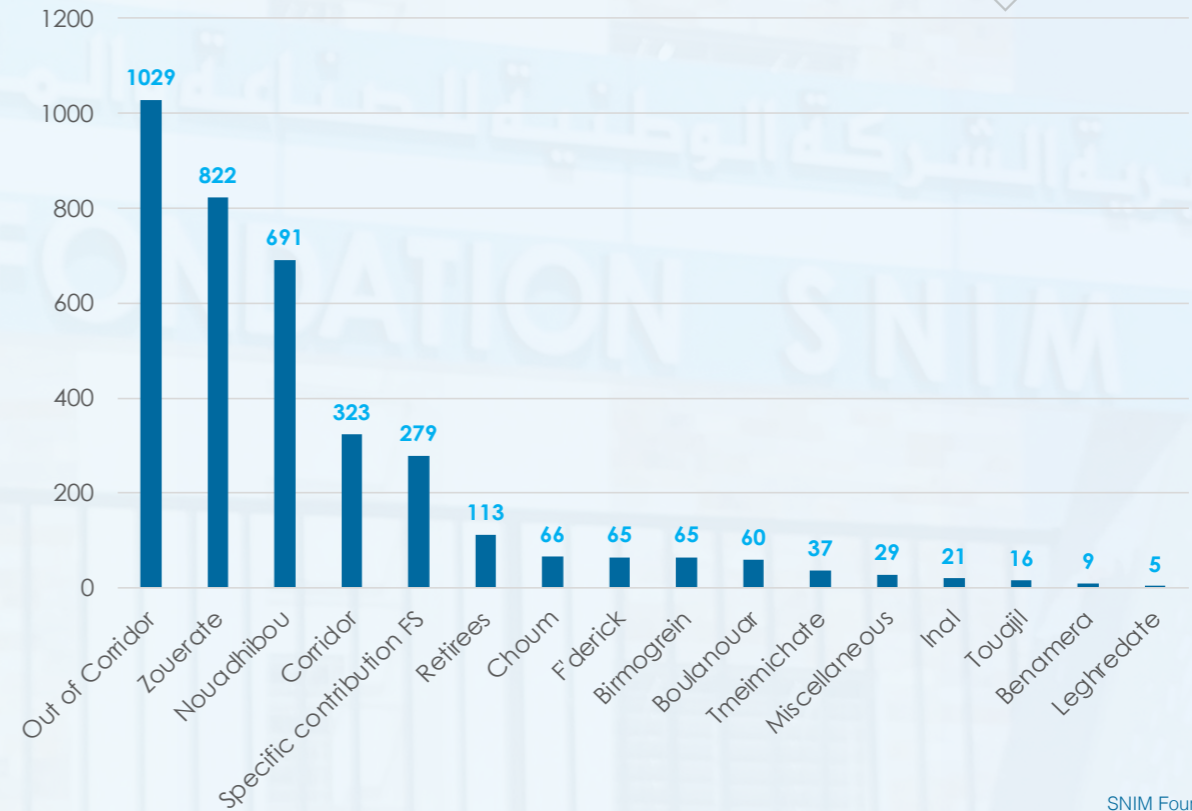

# 2023 ACTIVITY REPORT

## Highlights

Constructed 34 solar-powered boreholes, delivering 522,899 m<sup>3</sup> of water, and expanded the Zouerate reverse osmosis plant, which produced 1,080,000 m<sup>3</sup> of water in 2023.



The initiation of agricultural projects for the first time in the localities of Choum, Fderick and at the level of the mining site of TO14 for the benefit of the population, with the use of greenhouse cultivation and drip irrigation techniques. In addition to training on the management of agro-market gardening projects and the selection of high-yield seeds.

The construction of 59 equipped classrooms and the complete renovation or rehabilitation of two schools.



The rehabilitation of the Boulanoir health centre, significantly increasing its capacity and initiating various improvement projects, including the extension of the school, the renovation of the slaughterhouse, the construction of butchers and fishmongers, as well as a mini reception centre for the homeless.



The Foundation's adherence to the national policy of promoting the Republican School resulted in the distribution of more than 10,000 standard school bags and kits and the provision of more than 20,000 school outfits in consultation with the relevant state services.

The expansion of support for retirees by extending to the group's subsidiaries, with an additional cost of 12 million MRU in 2023.

Opened a fifth solar-powered social support store in Achekrane, in the commune of Tmémichate.



Invested in 7 community shops and supported cooperatives, especially those led by women, to foster local economic development.

## Activity report by sector



### Support for water and energy

- Access to water



Sustainable Development Goal (SDG), Goal 6, which aims to ensure access to drinking water and sanitation, shows that the country is facing significant difficulties in meeting this essential requirement. In this context, the SNIM Foundation is firmly committed to supporting the efforts of the Mauritanian State to improve access to water, particularly in the northern region, where low rainfall exacerbates the need for water resources.

“ Significant progress in the SNIM Foundation’s efforts to alleviate water shortages. These initiatives include the equipment of four boreholes as part of the Mechroue Chwabine agricultural project, in partnership with retirees, as well as the purchase of water storage reserves to strengthen water security. ”

In addition, the Foundation ensured the maintenance of 35 boreholes along the corridor and equipped 11 new ones carrying out geophysical work for the

installation of water points in Birmoghrein and in the corridor at the level of F'de-reick

The Foundation took charge of the implementation and monitoring of 19 surveys, while carrying out the installation of equipment for brackish water in Zouerate.

These initiatives underscore the SNIM Foundation's ongoing commitment to enhancing sustainable water access in the zones most affected by climate change.



**Box 1: he water supply challenge**

Promoting access to water has always been a priority in SNIM programs since its establishment. The organization helps to stabilize populations in areas of demographic decline. The program launched in 2022 to locate exploitable drilling sites resulted in the construction, at the end of 2023, of 34 secure solar boreholes, equipped with large storage capacities to effectively meet needs, especially during periods of high heat.

This initiative also provides essential watering points for camels and small ruminants, while improving the management of transhumance movements, far from the railway line.

Thanks to this program, 522,899 m<sup>3</sup> were produced in 2023, not counting the production of the Zouerate reverse osmosis plant, which reached 1,080,000 m<sup>3</sup>.

This vast water pumping program had as a corollary, in addition to easing the constraint of the limited capacity of SNIM tanks to supply localities along the railway, the introduction of intensive agriculture as a new variant in the activities of the Foundation.

It should be noted that 39.86% and 12.89% of the annual budget allocated to access to water were respectively devoted to the construction of new boreholes and the extension of the capacities of the brackish water treatment plant installed in Zouerate. While 10.54% of the budget was allocated to the search for points that could be transformed into exploitable boreholes..



**Testimony :**

The Foundation has made enormous efforts to provide the region with watering holes for the camel herds. In order to perpetuate the benefits of these assets, we ask the Foundation to equip the installations with electric pumps. We also ask for shelters to protect us from the heatwave.



• Access to energy



Solar energy represents an essential and abundant resource in desert regions, offering a sustainable solution to the energy needs of communities that are often isolated and far from traditional electricity grids.

In Mauritania, where solar energy exists in abundant quantities, the use of solar lighting is a solution to bring the populations of these desert regions out of the darkness.

The Foundation distributed solar lighting kits, bringing light and essential energy access to isolated households along the

railway corridor. These kits allow, in addition to night lighting, to operate a television and sockets for recharging mobile phones.

Furthermore, in large urban centres such as Zouerate and F'derick, electricity is produced and distributed by SNIM.

## Support for Agriculture



Agriculture plays a vital role in the socio-economic development of arid regions such as Choum, F'derick and the TO14 mining site where SNIM operates. Faced with persistent rainfall challenges, these regions need initiatives that will enable them to strengthen the food security of their populations, such as those launched by the Foundation in Choum, F'derick and at the TO14 mining site in Zouerate.

Greenhouse cultivation and drip irrigation techniques were employed to address the region's arid conditions.

As for the benefits of this initiative, they are varied: mastery of the management of agro-market gardening projects, selection of high-yield seeds, fixation of populations on their lands, development of income-generating activities, food security, regeneration of biodiversity.

Introducing agriculture as a focus area builds on the Foundation's successful

drilling program, which has significantly improved water availability in the region.

## Support for education

The education sector receives a substantial portion of the SNIM Foundation's allocated budget.

In 2023, the Foundation invested 57% of its education budget (52.3 MMRU) in constructing, expanding, and renovating schools and preschools.

The Foundation's interventions in this sector were marked by the introduction of a new variant consisting of providing the children of SNIM workers with assistance in terms of scholarships, training for their professional integration and educational support for those of them who are preparing for national exams. All of this support absorbed 29.43% of the budget allocated to the sector.



The SNIM Foundation also initiated several actions, namely:



*The allocation of financial aid to 243 higher education students. This support is part of the plan to support the education and training of students enrolled in higher education establishments.*



*Distribution of 20,000 uniforms and several school supplies to students in schools in the wilayas of Tiris Zemmour, Dakhlet Nouadhibou and the city of Choum (Adrar).*



*Rehabilitation and equipment of several schools in various localities namely Zouerate, Nouadhibou, Boulenouar and F'derick.*



### Box 2: Enhanced educational support for children of SNIM employees

In 2023, SNIM launched a school support program for the children of its employees who were candidates in national exams. Over 60 teachers were mobilized thanks to the support of the Communication and Social Action in collaboration with ASC Kedia in Zouerate and ASC SNIM in Nouadhibou.

Between April and June 2023, the support courses covered all basic subjects. The program benefited 919 pupils, including 575 in Zouerate and 344 in Nouadhibou, in preparation for BAC, BEPC and first-year secondary school entry exams.



### Testimony :

I would like to express my deep gratitude to the SNIM Foundation for building our school, which includes twelve classrooms, twelve toilets, a management office, a meeting room and an office for the director. This building has become a symbol here in Choum, contributing to the education and improvement of the educational level of girls and boys. Currently, this institution welcomes more than 400 students. This school has played a crucial role in stabilizing the population in Choum.

## Support for Health



In addition to conventional infrastructure renovation and modernization projects infrastructures, **An innovative healthcare delivery approach was introduced in the railway corridor.** This involving medical caravans in partnership with specialized NGOs. This allows for regular monitoring and personalized, crucial for patients with chronic diseases.

This new approach goes beyond simply distributing medicines at health centers, a practice now replaced by an integrated and holistic approach aimed at sustainably improving the quality of health care provided.



In addition, expenditure in the health sector increased with the expansion of the affiliation to the National Health Insurance Fund (CNAM) to all SNIM Group retirees. At the end of 2023, the Foundation covered the contributions of 138 new insured persons, bringing the total number of beneficiaries to 1,914 retirees affiliated to the CNAM.

Other actions were carried out by SNIM in 2023 :

- The rehabilitation of the Boulanoir health center. This project has made it possible to significantly increase the center's capacity to accommodate and care for patients, in particular with the construction of maternity and radiology rooms.
- The performance of hundreds of specialized consultations provided by renowned practitioners in neurology and rheumatology.
- Grant for health awareness days in the corridor and in the towns of Zouerate and Birmogrein, in partnership with NGOs.



**21 specialized medical sessions were organized in Nouadhibou and Zouerate during the year 2023, thus facilitating access to healthcare in both cities.**



### Support and subsidies for religious institutions and activities



Religious institutions and activities receive consistent support from SNIM, which in 2023 included multiple forms of assistance:



Rehabilitation of several mosques: Mosque Rahmane in Cansado, Mosque Redwane in Nouadhibou...



Funded the pilgrimage to Mecca for 36 SNIM employees, retirees, and imams from local communities in 2023.



Organization of collective iftars in several localities, during the holy month of Ramadan.

Construction of a washhouse in the cemetery of the village of Ben Amera.

## Support and subsidies for social actions



In 2023, support and subsidies for social initiatives reached a record high of 50,155,000 MRU, driven by multiple factors :

- Expenditure incurred to supplement the pension of SNIM retirees to reach the national minimum wage level constituted more than 23% of the budget allocated to this heading ;
- The decision of the higher authorities of SNIM to extend this support to all retirees of SNIM subsidiaries ;
- Substantial support for deprived families and vulnerable households, representing 32.30% of the budget for this category, totaling 16,200,065 MMRU.



The disabled received 11.66% of the budget while women's cooperatives operating in this area were supported with 15.55% of the expenditure.



15.11% of this budget was allocated to meet various demands of indigent residents outside the mining corridor, thus demonstrating the Foundation's commitment to combating precariousness on a national scale.



### Testimony :

In 2014, the Foundation built this shop and equipped it with freezers and other equipment. Currently, this shop provides employment to 60 women. We are extremely grateful for the immense support of the Foundation.

Support for the development of municipalities



The improvement of living conditions and framework in mining towns, particularly for the town of Zouerate, in which its intervention helped to restore in 2023 **traffic lights and to provide functional premises for certain services in this city.**

The handover of keys to a fully equipped kindergarten in the commune of F'derick marks a significant commitment to preschool education and local development. This initiative is part of a broader effort to strengthen the public education system and promote social cohesion in Mauritania.

- Construction of a police station in Zouerate.



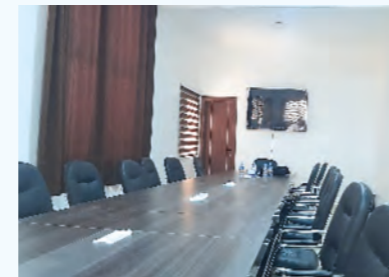


### Various achievements
